Reminder: 4-H members **must have taken the Livestock Expo** written test (by specie) to qualify for awards. Leaders should send or take their written request for tests in to the 4-H Office at least 2 days before picking them up. Tests will be available to leaders February 1st and are due in the 4-H office March 8th by 5:00 pm with a \$2 entry fee per test. They will be corrected Wednesday, March 15th.

Each club must furnish its own animals in every species again this year. The Livestock committee recommends 4 youth per animal. Pens will be made available by club for sheep and swine. Clubs/individuals must also provide any equipment that is needed that day for their project.

Group leaders and volunteers are needed to help out. **One person from each club to be a judge is required.** If you are interested tell your Community Leader so your name can be submitted.

2006/07 4-H STATE AMBASSADOR PROGRAM

The 4-H State Ambassador Program is a working honor that provides 4-H members expanded opportunities to serve the 4-H Youth Development program. 4-H State Ambassador is one of the highest service opportunities and recognitions attainable in the California 4-H Youth Development Program. 4-H State Ambassadors will be expected to make a 14-month commitment to the program beginning July 7, 2006 and ending August 31, 2007. They will be selected to provide support and leadership throughout the development and delivery of State and Regional 4-H Leadership Conferences, assist in the introduction of innovative programming for youth and families, and support various regional and statewide programs and activities; including public presentations and fund development. State 4-H Ambassador candidates must be a California 4-H member in good standing who is at least 16 years of age as of January 1, 2006, yet no older than 18 as of December 31, 2006. Each section will also select one outstanding adult volunteer to serve as "State 4-H Ambassador Team Advisor." Applications may be picked up in the 4-H Office and are due back to the County 4-H Office March 27, 2006.

COUNTY PRESENTATION DAY Saturday, March 25, 2006

Madera High School, North Campus **Human Resources Building** (Math/Home Ec)Corner 6th and N Streets

This year's Presentation Day promises to be a fun and exciting day for all 4-H'ers. There will be the traditional demonstrations and illustrated talks. There will also be categories for speeches - prepared and impromptu, audio/visual, problem solving and interpretative reading. Interpretive reading may be age appropriate children's stories, essays, poetry or an excerpt from a novel. The member is to present the reading as a story hour - no costumes or props are allowed. These categories will be offered at Sectional Presentation Day, Saturday, April 8th in Stanislaus County and be eligible for gold medal awards.

Learn to be a good, well rounded speaker and to organize your thoughts by taking part in County Presentation Day. Giving presentations is a terrific way to gain confidence in speaking in front of a group. That skill will not only help you in 4-H, it will also help you at school and later, in your career. Pick a topic that you are familiar with - your 4-H project, a hobby, a school sport. Write up a simple plan which would include an introduction, the body (where you develop the ideas in a logical order), and the conclusion (where you emphasize the main points). All presentations should be given exciting titles and illustrated with colorful, attractive posters. Examples of titles might be: Hamming It Up (swine), Foxy Boxes (arts & crafts), What Burns Never Returns (safety), Sticky Fingers (foods). Then practice enough so you know what you want to say or show, and you feel comfortable saying or showing it.

So have some fun and learn too! **DEADLINE for entries turned in to the 4-H Office is Monday, March 6th**.

Guidelines for preparing demonstrations, interpretative readings, audio/visual presentations, speeches-prepared and impromptu, problem solving and are available at the 4-H Office or at http://ca4h.org/leadership/spd. Presentations will be grouped by grade in school. Team demonstrations are limited to three members and the team will go into the group of the oldest member. An illustrated talk is similar to a demonstration in content, but nothing is actually demonstrated. A talk on the weather using weather charts is an illustrated talk, whereas a demonstration shows or teaches the how to. If you need to give your presentation outdoors, be sure to indicate this on your application. Please make sure that your form is filled out completely and correctly.

Each club that sends presentations to County Presentation Day must provide one (1) judge for every 5 presentations (or fraction of).
