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Washington/California Citizenship Focus Trips

A wide variety of citizenship learning activities for 4-H members are being planned beyond the county level.

For those members who are 13 years old or older, an eighth grade graduate at time of travel (June 2010) and currently serving as a Jr/Teen Leader we recommend the California Citizenship Focus trip - a four day study of our state government in Sacramento. This program will offer the 4-H member: a comprehensive look at all of the state legislative and judicial processes and a look at California history, heritage, cultures and industries.

For those members who are 16 years old or older (June-July 2010) at time of travel, have completed their Sophomore year in high school and are currently serving as a Teen Leader we recommend the Washington Citizenship Focus trip - a 7-10 day study of our federal government in Washington D.C. This program will offer the 4-H member: a comprehensive look at the federal government, how bills become law, and learn about 4-H activities in other states. The study group at the National 4-H Center will be comprised of 4-H members from several other states.

These programs are offered to all California 4-H members. The fees will be approximately \$495 for California Focus and \$1700 for the basic Washington Focus trip. Selected delegates are responsible for their initial (\$100/CA \$600/WA) deposit and will participate in a set number of fund raisers to earn part or all of their fees. The Madera 4-H Leaders Council also budgets a set amount for each of the delegates. Deadline for California/Washington Focus applications is Monday, October 5, 5:00 p.m.; interviews are scheduled for Wednesday, October 21 starting at 6:00 p.m. in the Demo Building

The pre-application criteria, established by the 4-H I&R Committee, *must have been met by the 4-H year prior to applying. Please read the application carefully.*

Re-Enrollment Time

It's re-enrollment time again. Your Community Club Leader will give you the re-enrollment packet. Please check vour re-enrollment form and add/correct/delete information where necessary. Please pay special attention to birth dates. Our old system just recorded the month and year and we need the complete birth date for the new 4H Online enrollment. Be sure to complete both sides of the Medical Form and be sure to include the date of the last tetanus shot. Read and sign the waiver form. For members-adults please be sure to include your child's age when you sign the waiver. Adults, for the Confidential form - please answer all questions where applicable.

Make sure you return the forms to your CCLs by the date they require. The CCLs must update their rosters and return all the forms to the 4-H Office by October 5th.

Write "Thank You" Letters!!

"Thank you" letters are very important. A "Thank You" should be sent for scholarships, 4-H award sponsors, fair buyers, donors for events such as the Washington and California Focus trips and the Silent Auction.

Be sure to show your appreciation to those who have contributed to 4-H and helped make your experience an enjoyable one, and to insure they will want to help others in the 4-H Program in the future.

State Record Book Competition

Time is fast approaching for 4-H members to get their record books ready for state competition. Books are due to the 4-H Office by October 23 for preparation to be sent to the State Office by November 6. A State 4-H Cover Page and County Check Sheet must be included before the book is submitted to state judging. Judging will be December 4-6.

Senior 4-H members (at least 14 years of age by December 31 of the program for which the book is being entered) are eligible to enter state competition. All 4-H work up to the end of the county program year should be included.

State level competition is focused on recognizing 4-H members who have outstanding 4-H Record Books and who have made a contribution to the 4-H Youth Development Program.

A state medal is awarded to members who have demonstrated personal growth in their leadership, citizenship and life skills development. At the state competition, the first round of judging will determine the books that receive a minimum of 90 points. 4-H Record Books receiving at least 90 points shall be declared "State Medalists." The second round of judging will determine "State Winners" based on available award funds for the year.

Preventing The Spread of Communicable Diseases (H1N1)

Each year, an average of more than 200,000 people are hospitalized and 36,000 people die from seasonal influenza (flu) complications in the United States. You can help keep yourself, your family and your fellow 4-H volunteers and members healthy and prevent the spread of seasonal colds, flue and other communicable diseases by practicing some simple measures at home, work, school and other social settings. In the fall of 2009, there is a particular concern over the novel H1N1 influenza virus (also known as the swine flu). The precautions to protect yourself from H1N1 are the same as those recommended for seasonal flu or other common communicable illnesses.

Take time to get vaccinated for seasonal influenza

- CDC recommends a yearly seasonal flu vaccine as the first and most important step in protecting against seasonal influenza. While there are many different flue viruses, the seasonal flu vaccine protects against the three seasonal viruses that research suggests will be most common.
- Vaccination is especially important for people at high risk of serious flu complications, including young children, pregnant women, people with chronic health conditions like asthma, diabetes or hear and lung disease, and people 65 yeas and older. Seasonal flu vaccine is also important for health care workers, and other people who live with or care for high risk people.
- A seasonal vaccine will not protect you against novel H1N1. A new vaccine against novel H1N1 is being produced and will be available in the coming months as an option for prevention of H1N1 infection to those at greatest risk.

Take everyday preventive actions

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it. If a tissue is not available, cough or sneeze into your sleeve. An informative and amusing video on covering your sneeze can be viewed at:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water, especially after you cough or sneeze. Alcohol-based hand cleaners are also effective.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose mouth. Germs spread this way.
- Try to avoid close contact with sick people.
- If you are sick with flu-like illness, CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone except to get medical care or for other necessities. (Your fever should be gone without the use of a fever reducing medicine.) Keep away from others as much as possible. This is to keep from making others sick.

Stay Informed

- In addition to the precautions above, it is important that you stay informed, especially during the upcoming flu season. Health officials will provide additional information as it becomes available. UC ANR EH&S has established a website at http://ucanr.org/hlnlflu to provide links to information from CDC, the California Department of Public Health, and County Public Health Departments to help bring you national, state, and local guidance as the flu season progresses. Follow public health advice regarding school closures, avoiding crowds, and other social distancing measures. When planning for camp, consult CDC guidance http://www.cdc.gov/hlnlflu/camp and local public health officials and develop a plan to respond to an illness outbreak at camp.
