Leaders must also take daily attendance at the fair and submit attendance sheets to the 4-H Office Monday, May 21, following the fair. Attendance information that is late to the 4-H will not be submitted to the schools

## HORSE OWNERSHIP **INFORMATION**

All horse ownership/lease papers need to be on file in the 4-H office by December 1st to show at spring fairs and May 1st to show at fall fairs. Please be aware that enrollment in the Horse Project needs to be on the same date as above. New members enrolling July 1 will be reviewed on an individual basis by Horse Chair and Youth Advisor.

A family owned horse may be shown by more than one 4-H member at a show under the following conditions: The horse can be shown in more than one showmanship class as long as it is shown in different age/grade divisions. That same horse can only be shown once in the rest of the disciplines, i.e.: Western Pleasure, Western Equitation, English Pleasure, Trail, Barrels, Etc.
